Reporting Allegations of Fraud, Waste, or Abuse

Complaints should describe as fully as possible:

- 1. The nature of the allegation.
- 2. The name(s) of the individual(s) involved.
- 3. The date(s) of the alleged misconduct or wrongdoing.
- 4. Any additional factual or verifiable supporting information available including, for example, others that may be aware of the wrongdoing.

Individuals who report allegations are encouraged to provide their name and contact information to facilitate follow-up. Confidentiality will be maintained to the greatest extent possible, unless disclosure becomes unavoidable during the course of the investigation.

Please note that complaints received by the Administrative Office will be referred to the Chief Judge of the affected court for appropriate action.
